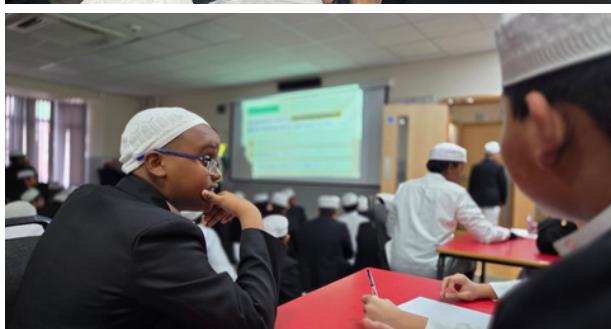


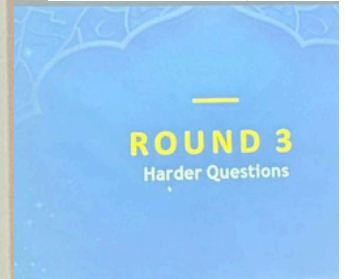
## Key Stage 3 & 4 Ramadan Competition A Celebration of Knowledge and Reflection

# Sarf (Arabic Morphology) Competition

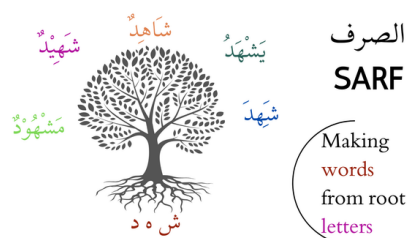
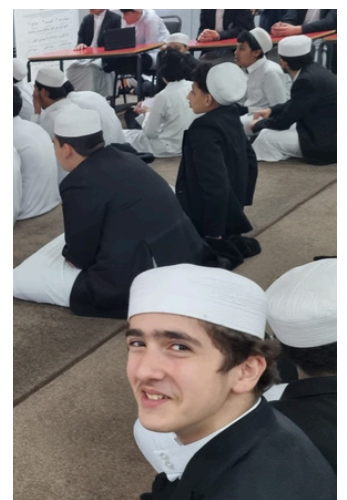
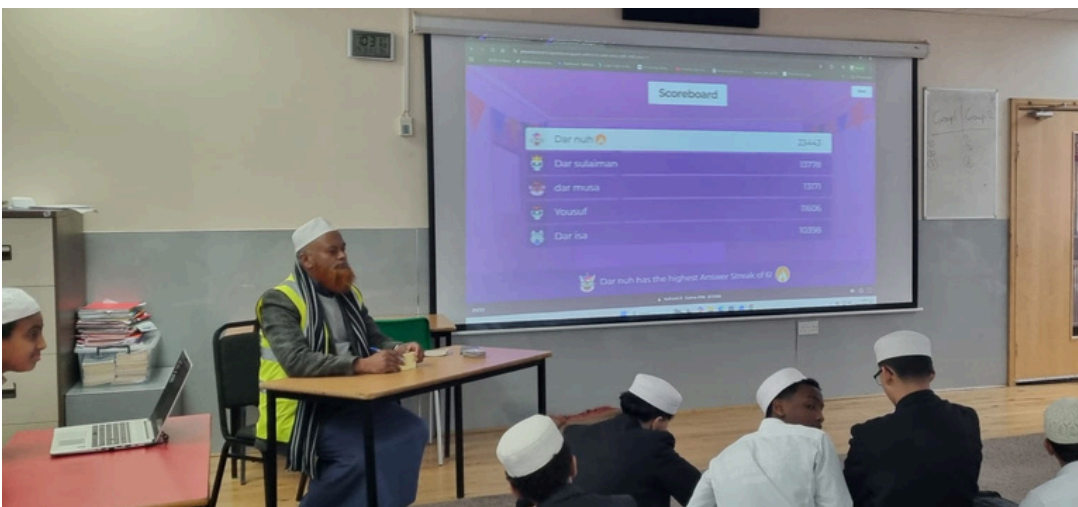

At our school, we have a special system called Golden Week, which encourages students to show excellent behaviour throughout the week.

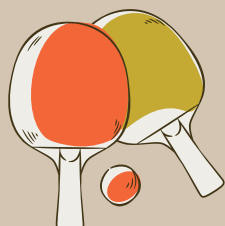
Each teacher awards Golden Tickets to students who display positive attitude, respect, and good conduct in and out of the classroom.

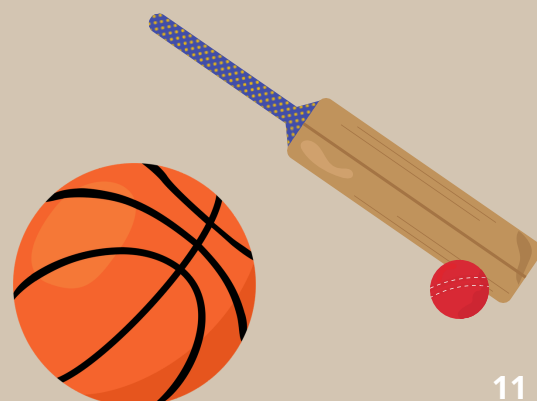
Golden Week teaches the importance of good behaviour, consistency, and effort. It encourages students to always try their best and reminds them that positive actions are always recognised and rewarded.

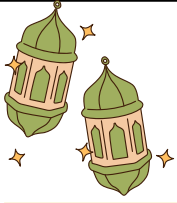

# Year 8 Sweet Success: Raising Funds for Our Playground

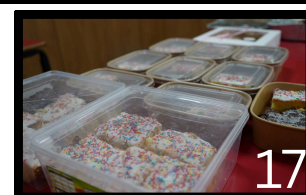

Alhamdulillah, their dedication has been an inspiration to us all.

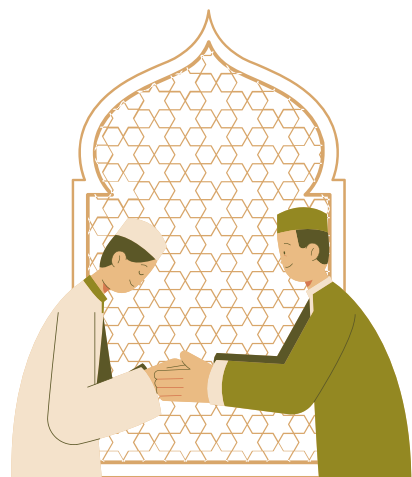


# Eid Message from all Staff

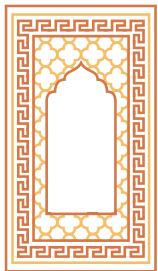


# Masjid Etiquette Workshop for KS4

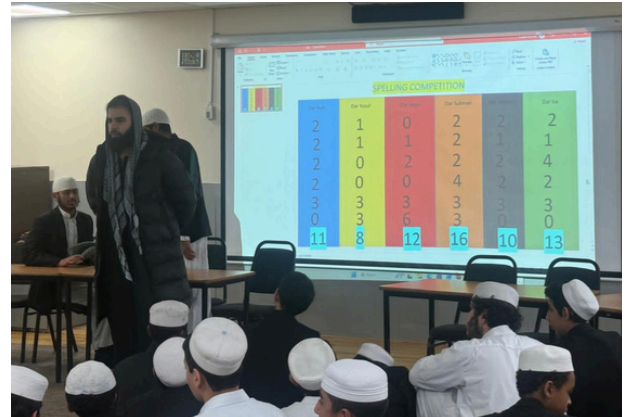
# End of Term Awards Celebration
