ASTON HALL TRIP







Our Year 9 class finally enjoyed an eagerly awaited educational trip to Aston Hall, diving into Birmingham's rich history. Aston Hall, a Jacobean masterpiece built between 1618 and 1635 by Sir Thomas Holte, has stood proudly for over 400 years and is reputed to be one of the UK's most haunted buildings.

During the trip, pupils explored architectural wonders such as the Long Gallery and the great oak staircase, bearing scars from the English Civil War.

They learned about the origins and key figures of the Civil War, Sir Thomas Holte's ties to the Royalist cause, Charles I's visit in 1642, and the Parliamentarian siege of 1643. The trip also covered the war's aftermath on the Holte family and the nation.

Pupils engaged deeply with history by dressing as key characters and Civil War soldiers, examining genuine artifacts, handling replicas, and reenacting battle tactics using replica pikes. The trip provided a vivid, hands-on learning experience that brought history to life.

CHANGE OF SCHOOL OPENING HOURS

For the upcoming academic year, the school will begin the day at **8am**. This change, discussed during our last parent conference, is crucial for enhancing our safeguarding measures. The additional time for Key Stage 3 (KS3) will be allocated to form classes, longer assemblies, and extended lessons. Additionally, the school day for Key Stage 4 (KS4) will end slightly earlier allowing them to finish at 4:30pm. Our KS4 boosters can also become more beneficial, as instead of a 30-minute short session, it will last for 45 minutes-1 hour, achieving a great deal more.



This adjustment is part of our long-term strategy to achieve excellence in all areas of the school. We kindly ask for your support in making this transition smooth and effective.

SUMMER SCHOOL




