KHUTBAH

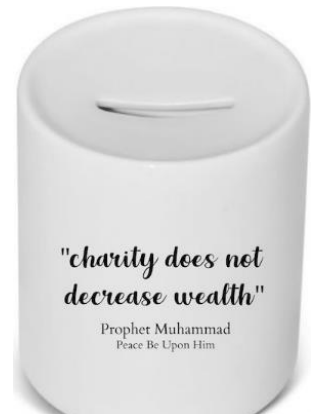

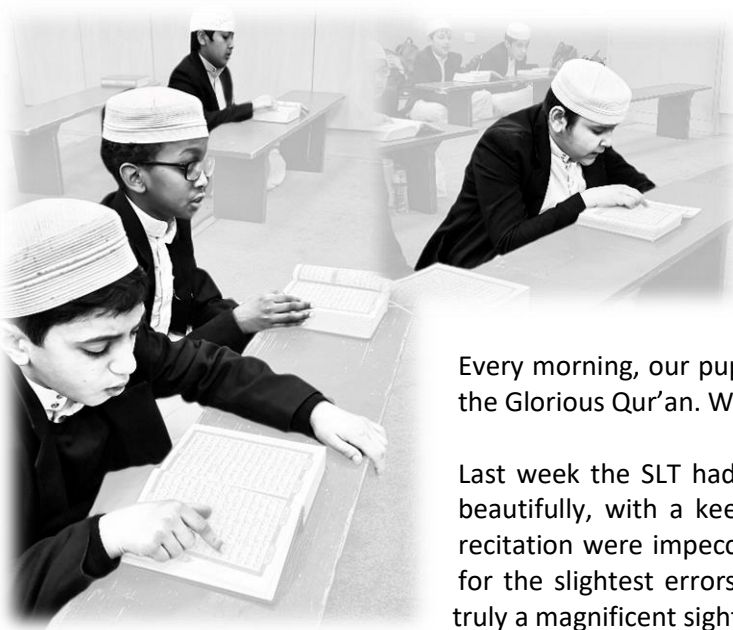
RAMADAN CHARITY CHALLENGE
